CANZ SPECIAL GENERAL MEETING 2020 UPDATE

Due to the disruptions caused by COVID-19, and the New Zealand Government declaring a national emergency, it is the view of the Council that the impact on the country and the crane industry will be significantly longer than the Level 4 lockdown, and the following restrictions from Levels 3 and 2. As such the Council postponed the 2020 Annual General Meeting and Conference and will be holding the next Association Conference on 14th — 16th July 2021 at Claudelands Event Centre in Hamilton.

With the above in mind, the Council has opted to hold a postal vote to enable the Association to comply with its legal obligation to send the approved Audited Accounts and the Annual Report to the Register of Incorporated Societies and to defer the remainder of the annual agenda to the 2021 Conference. Reform of Vocational Education announcement

On Thursday 14 May 2020, the Minister of Education, Hon Chris Hipkins, announced the formation of all six Workforce Development Councils (WDCs) would be fast-tracked for establishment by a target date of October 2020, ahead of the original target of mid-2021, to help support New Zealand's COVID-19 recovery.

COVID-19 has resulted in unprecedented impacts on New Zealand industry, employers, learners and communities.

As a result, there is an urgent need for a strong, unified, sustainable vocational education and training system to help lessen the social and economic impacts of COVID-19.

WDCs are at the heart of this system and their early influence will be critical in making sure that investment is well targeted and supports business growth alongside great careers.

Industry and employers have told the Tertiary Education Commission (TEC) they want a stronger voice for training, for both current and future employees.

Fast-tracking all six WDCs ensures their voice can be part of designing the response to COVID-19.

As planned, the arranging training capability of transitional Industry Training Organisations will still move to providers and their standard setting function will move to WDCs.

However, there is no intent to bring forward the deadline for the transition of arranging training.

It may be that this transition is completed sooner than the deadline of 31 December 2022 in cases where transitional Industry Training Organisations want this process to move faster.

Six skills based WDC interim Establishment Boards, made up of industry members, will be appointed in June 2020 to help stand up the WDCs.

This is an important step as it brings industry voice and influence on the heart of the new system as quickly as possible.

An Expression of Interest (EoI) process is now open until 2 June, and anyone who is passionate about vocational education, with strong governance experience and great communication and collaboration skills is welcome to apply.

Interim Regional Skills Leadership Groups are also being established.

Industries can engage at a local level to help these groups present the pressing labour and skills needs for their region.


In addition, industries can work with their local New Zealand Institute of Skills and Technology subsidiaries, PTEs and transitional Industry Training Organisations to ensure industry needs are being heard across the system.

The RoVE programme, including the WDC establishment and transitional Industry Training Organisation teams, is committed to working closely with Te Taumata Aronui; a group established to help ensure that RoVE reflects the Government's commitment to Maori-Crown partnerships.

There is a strong commitment to ensuring Maori and iwi are involved and able to provide input into the decisions made, including through the Order in Council (OIC) consultation later this year.

To achieve this, TEC is developing a dedicated Maori and iwi stakeholder communications and engagement tactical activity plan.

THE SIX WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT COUNCILS AND THEIR COVERAGE



The decision around final coverage areas will be made by the TEC and confirmed through OICs.

Each WDC's industry coverage will be described down to Level 4 of the **Australian and New Zealand Standard Industrial Classification** 2006 in the OICs.

An OIC is needed to establish the WDC as a legal entity. The OIC covers some very high-level elements of the WDC, such as name, coverage and governance arrangements.

The establishment of WDCs was enabled by the passing of the Education (Vocational Education and Training Reform) Amendment Act on 1 April 2020.

NOT GIVING UP ON YOUR MATES



New Zealand is undergoing a bit of a cultural shift regarding mental health.

While it is still a massively complex problem, with far too many people still taking their own lives, the rhetoric is

beginning to soften away from the Kiwi-ism that is "Harden up, mate".

However, some workplaces — especially in those stereotypically rugged or 'in-the-trenches' industries — haven't been quick to evolve their cultures to a more empathetic place.

Which is why Director of Emendas, Emma Jeffery, engages with **MATES in Construction**.

She deals with clients predominantly in construction and manufacturing industries, and sees first-hand some of those industries' prevalent challenges.

"They're working long hours. The job is quite physically demanding and out in the elements.

"There's a not a lot of fluff that comes with construction. It's all very 'harden up, mate' 'suck it up and get the work done', Kiwi culture.

"So, from the human resources side, it's common to be dealing with individuals in a disciplinarian or performance management sense."

But what she has realised in some cases, is that these industries all have some excellent employees, that just may need a bit of help.

Often in HR, Emma says, people are so focused on the things they can see — like not turning up to work or lack of communication — that their practices in HR don't always go to the level of identifying the root cause of the problem.

"Whereas what MATES in Construction has taught me is that we can't ignore the benefits of looking below that level.

"Because at the end of the day, the benefits of retaining employees can far outweigh the alternative. It's expensive to replace people in advertising, recruiting and training alone. Your support for the right people is returned in loyalty, productivity and workplace culture.

"But from an HR perspective I'm quite restricted in how much I can help people and give them the right support."

MATES in Construction gives her an avenue, when working with clients and companies, to put those employees in need of help in contact with the right people, with the right support network in place.

It means she is able to return those — who would seem like a — "problematic employee" back to work with a more sustainable career and a more focused pathway ahead of them.

"It has shown me that it's really important not to give up on people.

"We're all about improving people's mental health in New Zealand. But we don't always reflect that in our employment practices.

"And people don't always know what services to get in contact with. I mean, even from an HR perspective, I don't always know what vast community or industry support networks are available.

"MATES work in with a whole lot of different organisations and specialists in different fields, which means I know that when I pass them an employee, they are in really safe hands, and will get the right support based on what their individual needs are."

TOP 10 TIPS: CONTROLLING THE CONTROLLABLE

It will be a long road to recovery in the post-COVID world but the Crane Association of New Zealand's Past President. Scott McLeod, has 10 tips that should make life slightly easier in this month's Technical Corner.

Taking a page out of the Crane Industry Council of Australia Chief Executive Officer Brandon Hitch's book being able to control the controllable adds a much-needed calmness during a crisis.

So, here are top ten COVID-19 business and technical tips:

1. Get on the same page

The first tip is to ensure you're always up to date with the Government's COVID-19 website.

The Government's ongoing advice is crucially important right now. And it's in our interest, as business owners and employers, to implement government strategies within our everyday business approach. That will mean our businesses are just as strong and consistent moving forward.

That will be especially important as our country moves from Alert Level 2 to 1, and the need for ongoing contact tracing to ensure the population's health and safety.

So, we want to make sure we help New Zealand become world-leading in contact tracing.

2. Keep surfing the web

While you're on the internet, go check out the Construction Health & Safety NZ website if you haven't already.

A newly established organisation, it aims to raise the standard of health and safety across the whole of the construction industry. They're reading from the same safety song sheet CANZ is, so make sure you're aware of their residential construction protocols.

3. Wage subsidy extension

The wage subsidy scheme has been extended by a further eight weeks.

From June 10, businesses that have suffered, or expect to suffer, revenue loss of at least 50 per cent for the 30-day

period prior to the application date versus the nearest comparable period last year will be eligible for the extension of the scheme.

It will be available from 10 June 2020 until 1 September 2020, so you can keep paying your employees.

4. Cash is king

Keep working with your accountant to find the taps dripping money. They will help you find workable solutions while things are tight, and point you in the right financial direction.

5. Support a mate

I don't want to be a negative Nelly, but this topic needs highlighting. Life stresses happen in most people's lives, however coupled with stresses created at work, means we are often more vulnerable than others.

So, check out Mates in Construction — they raise awareness of mental health, wellbeing and suicide prevention in the workplace, and reduce the stigma around mental health in the workplace.

And just as important, they can connect you or a mate to the best available help and support that is practical, professional and appropriate.

6. Tip your hat, not your crane

The last set of five tips revolves around our industry's technical aspects – so, let's begin with what is the most obvious but still no less essential. Don't tip over your crane.

It may seem silly to say but it's got to be number one. Just because COVID-19 has changed a lot of things, good health and safety measures still apply. Continue checking for underground services, soil or working too close to embankments.

Good Crane-ing means not taking your eye off the ball. Don't let your team — who may have just come back from weeks in lockdown – down. Make sure you get back to basics so everyone can go home safe at the end of the day.

7. Invest in your employees

Train your guys well enough so they can leave, treat them well enough so they don't want to.

Right now is a perfect opportunity — in the quieter periods — to upskill and reinforce your team's training. Now is a good time to invest in them.

In saying that, you might find greater availability of our industry's trainers. Additionally, they're our mates too and will need our support as others tighten their purse strings — they'll be very grateful for the call and may sharpen their pencil on the price.

8. "Zero Energy"

If you haven't already, investigate your lockout systems for energy: hydraulic, mechanical, gravitational, electrical, etc — because it was only a few years ago that someone was seriously harmed.

It's one of those things that we are au fait with, and don't look at often enough. We assume the guys do it well.

So, is now another good time to ensure that they are actually doing it well and that you have got a good solid process? I've got some doing it now; making sure that the maintenance manager and the team have good processes around locking out energy sources when they're going to do any work on anything.

9. Maintenance update

The last thing you need when you're flat out working is any down time due to maintenance. So, if you're a bit quieter now, get ahead of the game and grease the carrier, the upper works, check wire ropes.

Take the time to make sure the gear is in top notch order for when it gets back out there. Don't just think of the crane either; there are other things that get hammered throughout the year.

It doesn't mean you have to spend money either; it just means you're taking the time to check these are alright.

10. Fit for duty, fit for work

I think we need to understand that people are experiencing lots of different pressures at the moment, even more so in these unsettling times, so we should be kind.

Being fit for duty and work also means being mentally fit, so you need good solid processes to check that they are. Just as importantly, you need to support them if they aren't.

ELECTRICITY NETWORK ASSOCIATION REMINDER

As you may be aware, if the crane pictured here was to accidentally touch the 11,000 lines, the entire crane would have been livened up to 11,000 volts and an electrical short circuit to the ground would have been created. Anyone standing in or around the crane would have received an electric shock which may have been fatal. In this scenario, the 11,000 volts lines would have been turned back on automatically after a few seconds and would have faulted again.

By law, the electrical codes of practice 34 (ECP34) states that when working within 4 metres of an electrical asset, written permission must be obtained. The close approach process identifies the:

- Work activity,
- Associated hazards,
- The minimum distance you can encroach on assets and,
- Required network safety measures.


The close approach application is made to control room a couple of days before you are required to encroach on the 4 metre limit around the asset.

New Zealand has twenty-nine electrical distribution businesses (EDBs). The Electricity Network Association (ENA) is a group that represents the EDBs in New Zealand. Please refer to the below link, which will give you access to the ENA lines company map, along with line company contact information.

HAND-HELD RADIOS



Crane operators regularly use hand-held radios for crane control purposes.

In the PRS band (personal radio service) there are 80 channels, of those there are 32 set a side for repeaters, leaving 48 for simplex use. The channels that are set aside for repeaters are 1-8, 31-38, 41-48,71-78.

As a reminder, we ask that if you are using a hand-held radio please avoid the mentioned channels at all costs for safety reasons, as the repeater (25 watts) is much more powerful than the little radios (1 watt) and the repeaters could wipe out the instruction from the hook man to the crane operator. Safety is our concern!

Alternatively, you can purchase a radio frequency specifically for your organisation through **Radio Spectrum Management**

NZ COVID TRACER MOBILE APP

The Ministry of Health recently launched the NZ COVID Tracer mobile app. They have asked the New Zealand business community to support its uptake, by providing QR scan code posters at business and other organisational locations.

The NZ COVID Tracer allows New Zealanders to create a digital diary of the places they've been, by scanning QR codes displayed at these locations. This helps log and track where people have visited and who they have come in contact with.

Businesses can register and download unique QR code posters for each of their premises through MBIE's Business Connect. In the first day of going live, nearly 7000 businesses registered with Business Connect to download posters, and this demand is expected to increase when further updates to the app are made by the Ministry of Health.

Using the app and downloading the posters is voluntary, but it helps contact tracing become faster and more effective, which is an essential part of stopping the spread of COVID-19 in New Zealand.

Be on the lookout for scam and fraud emails during this time. There has been a noticeable increase in invoice scams, where scammers send fake invoices requesting payment for goods or services that you didn't ask for or receive.

COVID-19: PPE USE FOR NON-HEALTH WORKERS VS RPE FOR WORKERS GUIDANCE INFORMATION.

At Alert Level 2 many people are back at work and we need to play it safe.

- 1. Respiratory protective equipment (RPE) is a type of personal protective equipment (PPE) that protects people from breathing in substances hazardous to health. This quick guide is for workers who use RPE at work: Respiratory Protective Equipment (RPE)
- 2. PPE refers to equipment such as face masks, eye protection or gloves normally worn to reduce everyday risks in the workplace, not just health care. Some workplaces already use PPE or wear a specific uniform to keep employees safe from the everyday risks of their particular job this should continue. Here is a quick overview, relating to Personal protective equipment use for non-health workers.

IMMIGRATION NZ: COVID-19 ALERT LEVEL 2

The New Zealand border is currently closed to all but New Zealand citizens and residents and their immediate family members travelling with them. However, the New Zealand Government acknowledges that there may be extremely limited circumstances where it is appropriate for a person who is not exempt from the border restrictions to travel to New Zealand.

NZ CONSTRUCTION COVID PROTOCOLS

Site Safe has worked with industry and government to update the COVID-19 Construction Protocols in anticipation of Alert Level 2. This update brings the protocols into line with what will be permitted at Level 2, including changes to physical distancing and travel. The Alert level 2 Vertical and Horizontal Construction Protocols are now available.

The information in this framework should be used to develop a plan specific to your project, site and business risks. This plan must then be communicated to workers and all relevant stakeholders — with the aim of creating a safe and respectful work environment for everyone. This framework has been developed in accordance with government advice and is designed to sit alongside your usual health and safety controls.

Enrolments now open for New Zealand Certificate in Cranes (Level 3 and 4)

We've recently made some changes to the crane qualification to make sure it's up to date and the best it can be. With the construction boom in full force, these changes have improved the qualification at a time where New Zealand needs more crane operators.

We have been working closely with the crane industry through CANZ, and subject matter experts to develop the level 3 and 4 Units Standards and related programmes and strands.

We can confirm that the NZ Certificate in Cranes (Level 3) with strands and the New Zealand Certificate in Cranes (Level 4) qualification is now available.

The Level 4 qualification will enable trainees to work in specialist crane operator or advanced dogman roles.

The available strands are:

- Advanced Dogman
- Crawler Crane
- Mini Crane
- Mobile Crane
- Non-Slewing Articulated Crane
- Tower Crane

The training normally takes around nine months, depending on the strand chosen.

Crane operators love working with heavy machinery, working in teams and have good hand-eye coordination.

If this sounds like a great way to spend your working day, you could have a bright future as a crane operator.

Cranes play a massive role in New Zealand's construction sector.

By becoming a crane operator you'll play a direct role in building up New Zealand's infrastructure. Whether it's lifting structures into place, moving heavy loads, or unloading containers from trucks — wherever there is development, there is a need for skilled crane operators.

Crane operators use cranes to move large, heavy objects. This can include materials on construction sites, containers on wharves, and heavy parts in factories.

There's lots of coordination and communication on the job — you're not the only one on the job! Whether you're operating the crane itself or you're on the ground directing the crane, it's all about the team working together effectively.

On any given day you could be:

- Driving mobile cranes to and from work sites
- Lifting loads using a crane
- Slinging loads for a crane to lift
- Checking that the crane is set up correctly and securely
- Checking the crane's water, fuel, and oil levels, as well as its other mechanical parts
